Participation in the workshop does not guarantee progress towards publication but will provide authors with advice and guidance to help them give improve their work and increase its chances.

Application and Participation Process

To apply to participate please supply:

- Have a paper idea (5 pages) or full draft paper, that you would like to develop through constructive critique, that fits with *BJM's* focus and content areas see: https://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/page/journal/14678551/homepage/forauthors.html
- Send us your draft paper in Word or PDF format, no later than 2 weeks before workshop date
 14th May 2023
- Your paper must have a cover page that includes: the author name(s) and affiliation(s); three-four keywords; and an email address for the lead author. An abstract of up to 200 words should be provided on the first page of the paper.
- Agree to your paper being discussed in a small group with other participants, as arranged by the workshop facilitators.
- Be willing and able to provide a short (5-minute maximum) overview of your paper to others in the discussion group.
- Commit to attending the whole workshop, if your paper is accepted.

The workshop will take this format:

0-40 minutes Introduction to BJM and Q&A

40-120 minutes Small group paper discussions, each led by a facilitator

The workshop is limited to a maximum of 20 papers
